# WHAT IS REDISTRICTING?

After the federal census, electoral district boundaries, including Supervisorial District boundaries, will be redrawn all over the nation to balance the populations in each district based on the census data.

Since the County's last redistricting effort in 2011, several bills were passed which require that certain conditions are met throughout the redistricting process.

The Planning Commission's role as the Advisory Redistricting Commission and the County's approval of district boundaries are only for Supervisorial Districts. Cities will be conducting their own redistricting process for city boundaries.

# STATE LAWS

## **AB 849**

- Fair Maps Act - Allows jurisdictions to establish an Advisory Redistricting Commission and requires that entities are transparent (must hold at least four public hearings/requirements for a dedicated redistricting webpage).

## **SB 1108**

- A person who is an elected official of the local jurisdiction, or a family member, staff member, or paid campaign staff of an elected official of the local jurisdiction, shall not be appointed to serve on the Commission.

## **AB 1276**

- Defines when new boundaries must be adopted. ***For County of Riverside: December 15, 2021.***

CALIFORNIA REDISTRICTING SUMMARY – SUPERVISORIAL DISTRICTS

<p>CRITERIA TO BE APPLIED</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• <b>Equal Population</b> of each district required to closest extent possible</li><li>• <b>Federal Law &amp; State Law</b>, as set forth below, must be followed</li><li>• <b>Population</b> to be adjusted to count inmates incarcerated at state correctional facilities individuals to their last known home address, not their prison address</li></ul>
	<ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1. <b>Geographic Continuity</b> that respects the contiguous boundaries. For example, areas that meet only at the points of adjoining corners are not contiguous and areas that are separated by water and not connected by a bridge, tunnel, or regular ferry service are not contiguous.</li><li>2. <b>Preserve Communities of Interest</b> to the extent practicable. A “community of interest” is a population that shares common social or economic interests that should be included within a single supervisorial district for purposes of its effective and fair representation.</li><li>3. <b>Respect Geographic Integrity</b> of a city or census designated place to the extent practicable.</li><li>4. <b>Boundaries Shall Be Easily Identified by Residents</b> meaning that to the extent practicable, districts shall be bounded by natural and artificial barriers, including streets.</li><li>5. <b>Geographic Compactness</b> should be encouraged to the extent practicable, where it does not conflict with previous criteria, and in a manner to ensure that nearby areas of population are not bypassed in favor of more distant populations.</li></ol>
<p>PROHIBITED CRITERIA</p>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1. <b>Favoritism Is Prohibited</b> for the purpose of favoring or discriminating against a political party, incumbents or political candidates.</li></ol>

## 2021 Redistricting Framework








# 2011 Supervisorial District Boundaries With 2020 Census Population Data
