#### **BACKGROUND:**

#### **Summary**

On March 11, 2021, President Biden signed the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 (H.R. 1319) in to law. The \$1.9 trillion package is intended to combat the COVID-19 pandemic, including the public health and economic impacts.

As part of the \$362 billion in federal fiscal recovery aid for state and local governments, \$65.1 billion is provided in direct aid to counties. Riverside County's share of the American Rescue Plan funding is estimated to be \$479 million, of which the first installment of \$239,937,299 was received on May 10, 2021, and the second of equal amount on June 6, 2022. Funds must be obligated by December 31, 2024, and expended by December 31, 2026.

On April 27, 2021, the Executive Office presented the Board of Supervisors with a preliminary ARPA funding allocation and on October 19, 2021, presented a revised funding allocation after the U.S. Treasury released the ARPA interim funding guidelines. The revised allocation included a new category for Child Care. The funding allocation obligates funds to 7 categories: Infrastructure, Housing & Homelessness, Economic Recovery, County Departments Response, Non-Profit Assistance, Child Care and Revenue Backfill.

On February 8, 2022, the Executive Office presented the Board of Supervisors with a revised ARPA allocation which was primarily driven by a \$12M reduction in the Revenue Backfill, and on April 5, 2022, the Board approved transferring \$6,250,000 from the infrastructure category (District 2 allocation) to the Housing, Homelessness and Neighborhood Revitalization category in support of the Rancho Esperanza DPSS Houses and the Home Gardens Park projects. On October 4, 2022, the Board of Supervisors approved the 2<sup>nd</sup> ARPA Installment Allocation (Attachment B- ARPA 2<sup>nd</sup> Installment Allocation Infographic)

#### Infrastructure

The County obligated \$60.7 million (80%) of its Infrastructure ARPA allocation in the amount of \$75,750,000 to 21 county-wide water, sewer, and broadband projects. For additional details, refer to **Attachment C- ARPA Infrastructure Tracking.** 

#### Housing, Homelessness and Neighborhood Revitalization

The County obligated \$37.8 million (67%) of its allocation in the amount of \$56.2 million for projects aimed to expand emergency shelter, permanent supportive housing, and affordable housing countywide in addition to 1 neighborhood revitalization project in District 1. For additional details. Refer to **Attachment D- ARPA Housing, Homelessness and Neighborhood Revitalization Tracking.** 

#### **Economic Recovery**

The County obligated \$22.7 million (63%) of its Economic Recovery allocation in the amount of \$36 million in support of county-wide Tourism Recovery Campaign, Business Revitalization and Paving projects. For additional details, refer to **Attachment E- ARPA Economic Recovery Tracking**.

#### **County Departments Response**

The County obligated \$10.7 million (34%) of its County Departments Response allocation in the amount of \$30.9 million. The obligations included ARPA eligible administrative expenses, COVID-19 testing kits for asylum seekers and salary reimbursements for re-purposed labor associated with the ARPA funding administration effort. For additional details, refer to **Attachment F- ARPA County Departments Response Tracking.** 

#### Non-profit Assistance

Our non-profits provide essential community support services that will assist in our recovery and increase our resiliency as a County moving forward. The Board approved the allocation of \$1 million for the establishment of the Coronavirus Recovery Community Improvement Designation Funds to support non-profit organizations

responding to the public health emergency or the negative economic impacts of COVID-19 within Riverside County. As of October 4, 2022, the Board approved 84 non-profits ARPA CID applications in the amount of \$797,000. On July 26, 2022, the Board of Supervisors approved the allocations of \$15 million in ARPA funding to establish the Riverside County Non-Profit Roundtable to address the negative economic impacts of the pandemic on non-profits and to support community efforts carried out by the non-profit sector. #### **Child Care**

ARPA also provides eligibility for programs and efforts supporting the return of working parents to the workforce including early care and education retention, recruitment, and expansion of workforce, providers, and facilities. On September 14, 2021, the Board approved the allocation of \$15 million for the establishment of Early Care & Education (ECE) Recovery Fund to stabilize and expand availability of ECE to support the return of working parents to the workforce.

As of September 30, 2022, \$6,226,800 has been paid to 5,189 early childhood educators. In addition, \$76,500 paid to 55 recruited ECE businesses to provide subsidized care for children (in partnership – administered through Riverside County Office of Education). As it relates to Child Care infrastructure, the Board of Supervisors approved obligating \$1 million in ARPA Child Care funds to District 1 – Lakeland Village Child Care project (BOS Item 3.8, ID#18696).

#### Revenue Backfill

The County elected to receive the standard \$10 million revenue backfill allowance which was expended towards County services for Homelessness, RUHS-FQHCs and Economic Development.

#### **Additional Fiscal Information**

As of October 4, 2022, the County obligated \$173 million in ARPA funding to Infrastructure, Housing & Homelessness, County Departments Response, Non-Profit Assistance and Child Care and staff anticipates obligating an additional \$26.5 million by

October 31, 2022, for a total obligated amount of \$199.5 million (which represents 82% of the total ARPA 1<sup>st</sup> installment amount of \$239,937,299). **For additional details, refer to Attachment I – ARPA Financial Report.**
