BACKGROUND:

Summary

On March 11, 2021, President Biden signed the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) of 2021 (H.R. 1319) in to law. The \$1.9 trillion package is intended to combat the COVID-19 pandemic, including the public health and economic impacts.

As part of the \$362 billion in federal fiscal recovery aid for state and local governments, \$65.1 billion is provided in direct aid to counties. Riverside County's share of the ARPA funding is \$479,874,599, of which the first installment of \$239,937,299 was received on May 10, 2021, and the second installment in the same amount was received on June 6, 2022. The funds must be obligated by December 31, 2024 and expended by December 31, 2026.

On October 4, 2022, (Agenda Item 3.44) the Board of Supervisors (Board) approved the ARPA second installment funding allocation which distributed \$33 million per district to be obligated towards infrastructure, housing and homelessness, workforce development, neighborhood revitalization, business revitalization, childcare facilities, and non-profits.

The County of Riverside Transportation Department is recommending allocating a total of \$3,500,000 from the ARPA 2nd installment funding as follows:

D20059 – Carver Tract Sidewalk Improvement Project Phase 3 - \$3,500,000

Construction costs associated with the final phase (Phase 3) of the Carver Tract Sidewalk Improvement Project. This project would allow for the construction of Phase 2 and Phase 3 to occur simultaneously, which are currently in the final design stage. Phase 1 of the Carver Tract Sidewalk Improvement Project was completed in November 2022.

Impact on Residents and Businesses

The proposed improvements will improve pedestrian safety and provide an ADA compliant path. In addition to the residents of the Carver Tract Community, there are several community facilities providing goods and services to local residents that are within walking distance of the project and will be served by the project improvements including: Martin Van Buren Elementary

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School, New Seasons Church, Coachella Valley Rescue Mission, Coachella Valley Wild Bird Center, Riverside County Office of Education, Rancho Las Flores Park, and the United Families/Fred Young Farm Labor Center
