SUBJECT: District 1: Lakeland Village Sports Park - California Environmental Quality Act Exempt, Approval of In-Principle and Preliminary Project Budget, District 1. [\$5,000,000 - 100% American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) Fund]

RECOMMENDED MOTION: That the Board of Supervisors:

1. Approve the Lakeland Village Sports Park (Lakeland Village Sports Park) Project for inclusion in the Capital Improvement Program (CIP);

2. Find that the Project is exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) Pursuant to State CEQA Guidelines Sections 15301, Class 1 Existing Facilities Exemption, Class 3 New Construction or Conversion of Small structures Exemption identified in Section 15303, Class 11 Accessory Structures Exemption, and Section 15061 (b)(3) "Common Sense" Exemption;

3. Approve in-principle the Lakeland Village Sports Park Project located in Lake Elsinore, California, for the rehabilitation of two (2) existing baseball fields, new restroom/concession stand, and hardscape;

4. Approve the preliminary project budget in the not to exceed amount of \$5,000,000 for the Project;

5. Authorize the use of American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) Fund not to exceed \$5,000,000, including reimbursement to Facilities Management (FM) for incurred project related expenses;

6. Delegate project management authority for the Project to the Director of Facilities Management in accordance with applicable Board policies, including the authority to utilize consultants on the approved pre-qualified list for services in connection with the Project, and within the approved project budget; and

7. Authorize the Purchasing Agent to execute pre-qualified consultant service agreements not to exceed \$100,000, per pre-qualified consultant, per fiscal year, in accordance with applicable Board policies for this Project, and the sum of all project contracts shall not exceed \$5,000,000

BACKGROUND: Summary

The Lakeland Village Sports Park is located within the site of the Lakeland Village Community Center in the Lakeland Village area, just west of the City of Lake Elsinore. The existing dilapidated ball field area is located on the west end of the community center and is approximately 4.5 acres in size. The scope of the project will include but not be limited to renovation of two (2) existing ball fields with open area for soccer field overlay areas, storage area for portable soccer goals, installation of artificial turf in the in-field areas, walks to connect the fields, supplemental irrigation system, and ADA circulation.

Facilities Management recommends that the Board approve the Lakeland Village Sports Park Project, the preliminary project budget in the not to exceed amount of \$5,000,000. FM will pursue the most cost-effective project delivery method and award in accordance with applicable Board policies.

With certainty, there is no possibility that the Lakeland Village Sports Park Project may have a significant effect on the environment. The Project, as proposed, is limited to the rehabilitation of the recreation area at the Lakeland Village Community Center which has deteriorated to a condition that cannot provide safe recreational activity. The improvements needed to restore the function of the recreational area includes the renovation of the existing sports fields for baseball and soccer, as well as open green space for general recreational activity, and a new prefabricated accessory structure under 2,500 square feet to provide a restroom/concessions facility. The improvements would restore the use of an existing recreational facility and would meet the scope and intent of the Common Sense Exemption identified in Section 15061 (b)(3), Class 1 Existing Facilities Exemption identified in Section 15301, Class 3 New Construction or Conversion of Small structures Exemption identified in Section 15303, and Class 11 Accessory Structures Exemption identified in Section 15311. As the Project is anticipated to receive federal funding, the Project was also reviewed under the National Environmental Policy Act and found to be categorically excluded under Section 58.35(a)(1) as the project entails the improvement and rehabilitation of existing public facilities and improvements that will not result in a change of use or significant increase in capacity. A Notice of Exemption will be filed by FM staff with the County Clerk within five days of Board approval.

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In its final funding guidelines issued on January 6, 2022, the U.S. Treasury broadened the use of the ARPA funds to include neighborhood and community development projects in disproportionately impacted communities that promote improved health and safety outcomes, such as parks, green spaces, recreational facilities, sidewalks, pedestrian safety features like crosswalks, projects that increase access to healthy foods, streetlights, neighborhood clean-up, and other projects to revitalize public access. The project estimated cost in the amount of \$5,000,000 will be provided from the Housing, Homelessness and Neighborhood Revitalization funding category.

Impact on Residents and Businesses

The Lakeland Village Sports Park will provide a community gathering space and will transform an existing ball field into an active, lively, and green place. Furthermore, parks investments in the County will improve physical and mental health outcomes. Allowing the public access to nature, including parks, has been connected to decreased levels of illness and increased well-being.
