## **Background:**

Pursuant to California Health and Safety Code Section 34177(j) and 34177(l), Successor Agencies are required to prepare a Recognized Obligation Payment Schedule (ROPS 14-15A) and a proposed administrative budget, included as Exhibit "A" and Exhibit "B", respectively, and submit it to the Oversight Board for approval.

The attached Exhibit "B" of Resolution No. 2013-006 is the Successor Agency to the Riverside County Redevelopment Agency Administrative Budget, which provides the estimated administrative cost for the January through June 2014 fiscal period. It provides a summary of the non-housing and housing direct and indirect costs for the given fiscal period.

## **RESOLUTION NO. 2014-001**

A RESOLUTION OF THE OVERSIGHT BOARD FOR THE SUCCESSOR AGENCY TO THE REDEVELOPMENT AGENCY FOR THE COUNTY OF RIVERSIDE ADOPTING THE RECOGNIZED OBLIGATION PAYMENT SCHEDULE 14-15A, FOR THE PERIOD OF JULY 1, 2014 THROUGH DECEMBER 31, 2014

WHEREAS, redevelopment agencies were dissolved as of February 1, 2012, following a California Supreme Court ruling in *California Redevelopment Association v. Matosantos* upholding Assembly Bill x1 26 ("ABX1 26"); and

WHEREAS, the Successor Agency to the Redevelopment Agency for the County of Riverside (Successor Agency) is responsible for implementing ABX1 26; and

WHEREAS, provisions of ABX1 26 require that each Successor Agency have an oversight board to oversee and review the actions of the Successor Agency as it winds down the affairs of the former Redevelopment Agency; and

WHEREAS, an oversight board has been formed, pursuant to Health and Safety Code Section 34179; and

WHEREAS, Health and Safety Code Sections 34177(I) and (m) require the Successor Agency to prepare a Recognized Obligation Payment Schedule ("ROPS") for each sixth month fiscal period and submit it to the Oversight Board for approval; and

WHEREAS, the Successor Agency recommends Oversight Board adoption of the ROPS 14-15A and for the period of July 1, 2014 through December 31, 2014.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, FOUND, AND DETERMINED by the Oversight Board for the Successor Agency to the Redevelopment Agency for the County of Riverside as follows:

- 1. The Oversight Board adopts the Recognized Obligation Payment Schedule attached hereto as Exhibit "A," the period of July 1, 2014 through December 31, 2014.
- 2. The Board Clerk shall electronically transmit this resolution to the Department of Finance as required pursuant to Health and Safety Code Section 34179(h).
- 3. Pursuant to Health and Safety Code Section 34177(m), the Department of Finance shall make its determination of the enforceable obligations and the amounts and funding sources of the enforceable obligations no later than 45 days after the Recognized Obligation Payment Scheduled is submitted. Pursuant to Health and Safety Code Section 34179(h), all actions taken by the Oversight Board may be reviewed by the State of California Department of Finance, and, therefore, this Resolution shall not be effective until five (5) business days after approval, subject to a request for review by the State of California Department of Finance.

## BACKGROUND: Summary

Pursuant to ABx1 26, more specifically subdivision I of Health and Safety Code Section 34177, as amended by AB 1484 (Dissolution Act), successor agencies are required to prepare a Recognized Obligation Payment Schedule (ROPS) before each six month fiscal period.

Furthermore, subdivision m of Section 34177 requires that, "commencing with the ROPS covering the period of July 1, 2013, through December 31, 2013, successor agencies shall submit an oversight board approved ROPS to the Department of Finance and to the county auditor-controller no fewer than 90 days before the date of property tax distribution."

Therefore, the Successor Agency to the Redevelopment Agency for the County of Riverside (Successor Agency) is required to submit to the oversight board an approved ROPS covering the period of July 1, 2014 through December 31, 2014 (ROPS 14-15A) by March 3, 2014. ROPS 14-15A is included as Exhibit A, and is requesting approval of \$26,414,210 from the Redevelopment Property Tax Trust Fund (RPTTF) for debt service and other non-administrative costs. \$18,265,637 in expenditures is being requested for previously approved project budgets, and is to be paid from redevelopment bond proceeds. The Successor Agency is also requesting approval of the expenditure of \$760,542 for project costs to be paid from reserve funds.

In addition to the ROPS, the Successor Agency is also required to submit a detailed Administrative Budget for each six-month ROPS reporting period. As shown on Exhibit B, the Administrative Budget for the Successor Agency for the period from July 1, 2014 through December 31, 2014 is projected to be \$792,426, and, if approved, will be funded from RPTTF. This amount represents the three-percent administrative allowance of all RPTTF projections for the ROPS 14-15A reporting period.

The aforementioned projected expenditures are components of the total budget of \$46,232,815 as requested on ROPS 14-15A.

## Impact on Citizens and Businesses

Adoption of these items will have a positive impact on the citizens and businesses throughout Riverside County. Residents are relying on the completion of the remaining projects in order to enhance their communities. Construction firms we have contracted with will also benefit from this action by being able to complete the project based on the reliance that they will be compensated. Further, approval of the ROPS provides authority to make debt service payments to benefit RDA bondholders.

# A RESOLUTION OF THE OVERSIGHT BOARD FOR THE SUCCESSOR AGENCY TO THE REDEVELOPMENT AGENCY FOR THE COUNTY OF RIVERSIDE DIRECTING THE COMMENCEMENT OF A REFUNDING OF CERTAIN BONDS.

WHEREAS, California Assembly Bill No. 26 (First Extraordinary Session) ("AB1X 26") adopted on June 29, 2011, dissolved all redevelopment agencies in existence in the State of California, as of February 1, 2012, and designated "successor agencies" and "oversight boards" to satisfy "enforceable obligations" of the former redevelopment agencies and administer dissolution and wind down of the former redevelopment agencies;

WHEREAS, Assembly Bill No. 1484, a follow up bill to AB1X 26, was enacted on June 27, 2012 and provides a mechanism to refund tax allocation bonds under certain circumstances;

**WHEREAS**, Health and Safety Code Section 34179(a) provides that each successor agency shall have an oversight board composed of seven members;

WHEREAS, an oversight board (the "Oversight Board") has been duly established for the Successor Agency to the Redevelopment Agency for the County of Riverside (the "Successor Agency") pursuant to Health and Safety Code Section 34179(a);

WHEREAS, the Oversight Board, pursuant to Health and Safety Code Section 34177.5(f), may direct the Successor Agency to issue bonds to refund the bonds of the now dissolved Redevelopment Agency for the County of Riverside (the "Former Agency") to provide debt service savings to the Successor Agency;

WHEREAS, an oversight board may only direct such a refunding so long as the successor agency is able to recover its related costs in connection with the transaction;

WHEREAS, the recovery of such costs in connection with such a refunding transaction shall be supplemental to, and not constrained by, the administrative cost allowance as such allowance is defined in Health and Safety Code Section 34171(b);

**WHEREAS**, the Oversight Board is informed by the Successor Agency that in 2004, the Former Agency issued the following bonds (collectively, the "Prior Bonds"):

- (i) Redevelopment Agency for the County of Riverside Redevelopment Project Area No. 1 2004 Tax Allocation Bonds, Series A, issued in the initial aggregate principal amount of \$24,865,000;
- (ii) Redevelopment Agency for the County of Riverside Jurupa Valley Redevelopment Project Area 2004 Tax Allocation Bonds, Series B, issued in the initial aggregate principal amount of \$16,715,000;
- (iii) Redevelopment Agency for the County of Riverside Mid-County Redevelopment Project Area 2004 Tax Allocation Bonds, Series C, issued in the initial aggregate principal amount of \$6,125,000;
- (iv) Redevelopment Agency for the County of Riverside Desert Communities Redevelopment Project Area 2004 Tax Allocation Bonds, Series D, issued in the initial aggregate principal amount of \$34,840,000; and
- (v) Redevelopment Agency for the County of Riverside Interstate 215 Corridor Redevelopment Project Area 2004 Tax Allocation Bonds, Series E, issued in the initial aggregate principal amount of \$20,240,000;
- (vi) Redevelopment Agency for the County of Riverside Housing 2004 Tax Allocation Bonds, Series A, issued in the initial principal amount of \$38,225,000; and,
- (vii) Redevelopment Agency for the County of Riverside Housing 2004
  Taxable Tax Allocation Bonds, Series A-T, issued in the initial principal amount of
  \$37,000,000.

WHEREAS, the Prior Bonds are subject to optional redemption on any date on or after October 1, 2014 at a redemption price of 100% of the outstanding principal amount thereof plus accrued and unpaid interest thereon;

WHEREAS, the Successor Agency, has indicated that there are potential debt service savings that can be achieved through a refinancing of all or a portion of the Prior Bonds, and the Oversight Board now wishes to direct the Successor Agency to prepare for the refunding

of all or a portion of the Prior Bonds, and such other bonds of the Former Agency as may be hereafter identified, to achieve debt service savings; and

WHEREAS, the County of Riverside (the "County"), a political subdivision of the State of California and taxing entity recipient of property tax revenues, represented by voting membership on this Oversight Board, has developed a program (the "Refunding Program") to assist successor agencies within the County to refund tax allocation bonds pursuant to AB 1484 in order to provide debt service savings to the Successor Agency, efficiencies in issuance and cost of issuance savings.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, FOUND, AND DETERMINED by the Oversight Board for the Successor Agency to the Redevelopment Agency for the County of Riverside as follows:

- **1.** The Recitals set forth above are true and correct and are incorporated into this Resolution by this reference..
- 2. Pursuant to Health and Safety Code Section 34177.5(f), the Oversight Board hereby directs the Successor Agency to prepare to issue bonds (the "Refunding Bonds"), which bonds may be sold to a joint powers authority pursuant to the Marks-Roos Local Bond Pooling Act (Article 4 (commencing with Section 6584) of Chapter 5 of Division 7 of Title 1 of the Government Code) following a determination by the Successor Agency to participate in the Refunding Program, to refund all or a portion of the Prior Bonds; provided that this request shall not offer any assurance that bonds will be sold by the issuer under the Refunding Program to refund all or any portion of the Prior Bonds. The Successor Agency is further directed to return to the Oversight Board, once the refunding issue and related documents have been prepared, for approval of the refunding pursuant to Health and Safety Code Section 34180(b).
- 3. The Oversight Board hereby authorizes and approves the Successor Agency to cover reasonable related costs incurred in connection with this refunding transaction, including the costs incurred by the County of Riverside (the "County") in connection with this refunding transaction, which costs the County is incurring on behalf of the Successor Agency. The

Successor Agency and the County may recover such costs from the proceeds of the Refunding Bonds or, if the Successor Agency is not able to issue its bonds or the issuer under the Refunding Program is not able to issue its bonds relating to the Successor Agency, by including such costs in a future Recognized Obligation Payment Schedule. The recovery of such costs shall be in addition to and shall not count against any administrative cost allowance of the Successor Agency as such allowance is defined in Health and Safety Code Section 34171(b).

- 4. If any provision of this Resolution or the application of any such provision to any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of this Resolution that can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this Resolution are severable. The Oversight Board declares that the Oversight Board would have adopted this Resolution irrespective of the invalidity of any particular portion of this Resolution.
- 5. Pursuant to Health and Safety Code Section 34179(h), all actions taken by the Oversight Board may be reviewed by the California Department of Finance and, therefore, this Resolution shall be effective five (5) business days after notice to the Department of Finance unless the Department requests a review of the actions taken in this Resolution, in which case this Resolution will be effective upon approval by the Department.

These bonds, with the exception of the \$37,000,000 in Series 2004 A-T Bonds, will reach their ten (10) year call date and are callable on October 1, 2014. The proximity to the call date makes a number of the bond maturities attractive refunding candidates. The Successor Agency wishes to refund the callable bonds in order to achieve debt service savings that will accrue to the benefit of the Successor Agency, the County, and other applicable taxing entities.

On September 24, 2013, the Board of Supervisors approved in principle the initiation of a County Redevelopment Bond Refunding Program (Agenda Item 4-1). The purpose of the program is to minimize the amount of time and effort required of each Successor Agency (SA) in the county to complete a bond refunding. The Program is managed by a finance team assembled by the County, and each SA and Oversight Board must approve any proposed refunding of RDA debt in order to authorize financing. The Riverside County Public Financing Authority will implement the refunding of the bonds.

The city of Indian Wells is currently participating in the program, and its SA and Oversight Board have approved an RDA bond refunding for 2003 bonds that reached their ten (10) year call date in September 2013. The Program team is working with the Department of Finance (DOF) to facilitate the review, and the deal is expected to close by March of 2014.

The Program team, is prepared to undertake the proceedings for refunding the 2004 County SA bonds. In order to proceed, the Board must enter into the Refunding Agreement to enable the Public Financing Authority to implement the refunding. In addition, adoption of Resolution No. 2014-003 is required by the DOF to be submitted to the Oversight Board, in order to initiate the process and provide DOF with notice of the upcoming refunding. After approval of Resolution No. 2014-003, the Program team will assemble the various required legal and underwriting documents and bring all the documents back to the Board for final approval in a few months. Once final approval is obtain by the SA and Oversight Board, the documents and reports will be submitted to the DOF for their approval prior to any bonds being sold.

The criteria for moving forward with the bond issuance will be an acceptable level of savings targeted at 3% or better of net present value savings.

Staff recommends execution of the Refunding Agreement, adoption of Resolution No. 2014-003, and submittal to the Oversight Board. These actions will allow the Program team to move forward with evaluating the terms of refunding to achieve the maximum debt service savings.

## Impact on Citizens and Businesses

This item will be beneficial for the citizens of Riverside County. County residents and businesses will ultimately benefit from the surplus tax revenue that will be derived from this refunding. The savings in debt service payments that will be achieved by the refunding will be distributed to taxing entities including the County General Fund, K-12 school districts, and community college districts. The taxing entities will in turn have additional revenue to use for services for the residents of Riverside County.

WHEREAS, prior to the dissolution of the Former Agency, the Former Agency issued the following series of bonds for the purpose of financing and refinancing redevelopment activities (collectively, the "Prior Bonds"):

- (iii) Redevelopment Agency for the County of Riverside Mid-County Redevelopment Project Area 2004 Tax Allocation Bonds, Series C,

- issued in the initial aggregate principal amount of \$6,125,000; and,
- (iv) Redevelopment Agency for the County of Riverside Desert Communities

  Redevelopment Project Area 2004 Tax Allocation Bonds, Series D,

  issued in the initial aggregate principal amount of \$34,840,000;
- (v) Redevelopment Agency for the County of Riverside Interstate 215

  Corridor Redevelopment Project Area 2004 Tax Allocation Bonds, Series

  E, issued in the initial aggregate principal amount of \$20,240,000;
- (vi) Redevelopment Agency for the County of Riverside Housing 2004 TaxAllocation Bonds, Series A, issued in the initial principal amount of \$38,225,000; and,
- (vii) Redevelopment Agency for the County of Riverside Housing 2004

WHEREAS, Section 34177.5 authorizes the Successor Agency to undertake proceedings for the refunding of outstanding bonds and other obligations of the Former Agency, subject to the conditions precedent contained in Section 34177.5;

WHEREAS, pursuant to Code Section 34179, an oversight board (the "Oversight Board") has been established for the Successor Agency and representatives of the Successor Agency and the Oversight Board have informally discussed the possibility of refunding the Prior Bonds;

WHEREAS, the County of Riverside (the "County"), a political subdivision of the State of California and taxing entity recipient of property tax revenues, represented by voting membership on the Oversight Board, has developed a program (the "Refunding Program") to assist successor agencies within the County to refund tax allocation bonds pursuant to AB 1484 in order to provide debt service savings to successor agencies, efficiencies in the issuance process and cost of issuance savings;

WHEREAS, the Riverside County Public Financing Authority (the "Authority") a Joint Powers Authority, organized and existing under the laws of the State of California, created pursuant to a Joint Exercise of Powers Agreement, dated March 20, 1990, by and between the County of Riverside and the Former Agency pursuant to the Marks-Roos Local Bond Pooling Act, will, in connection with the Refunding Program, purchase refunding bonds issued by successor agencies within the County, including the Successor Agency;

WHEREAS, the Successor Agency has determined to participate in the Refunding Program with the goal of refunding the Prior Bonds to achieve debt service savings that will accrue to the benefit of both the Successor Agency and the applicable taxing entities as a result of the refunding; and

WHEREAS, the Successor Agency requests that the Oversight Board direct the Successor Agency to undertake such refunding proceedings, it being understood that such direction by the Oversight Board will enable the Successor Agency to recover its related costs in connection with the refunding proceedings, as authorized by Section 34177.5(f);

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Successor Agency to the Redevelopment Agency for the County of Riverside, as follows:

Section 1. <u>Determination to Refund Prior Bonds</u>. The Successor Agency hereby determines that it intends to refund the Prior Bonds in accordance with and pursuant to California Health and Safety Code Section 34177.5. The Successor Agency hereby determines to utilize the County's Refunding Program in connection with the issuance of its refunding bonds. The appropriate officers of the Successor Agency are hereby authorized and directed to enter into the Refunding Program Agreement with the Authority in the form presented to the Successor Agency.

Section 2. <u>Filing of Resolution</u>. The Secretary of the Successor Agency is hereby authorized and directed to file a certified copy of this Resolution with the Oversight Board, and, as provided in California Health and Safety Code Section 34180(j), with the Riverside County

Administrative Officer, the Riverside County Auditor-Controller and the California Department of Finance.

Section 3. Request for Direction. The Oversight Board is hereby requested to direct the Successor Agency to undertake the refunding of the Prior Bonds.

Section 4. Preparation of Proceedings. Upon receipt of the direction of the Oversight Board, the Successor Agency will cause the preparation of appropriate proceedings for the issuance of bonds to refund the Prior Bonds, and will submit such proceedings to the Oversight Board for approval in accordance with the provisions of California Health and Safety Code Sections 34177.5 and 34180.

Section 5. Appointments. C.M. de Crinis & Co., Inc, as financial advisor, Citigroup Global Markets Inc., as lead underwriter, Jones Hall, A Professional Law Corporation, as bond counsel, and Best Best & Kreiger LLP, as disclosure counsel, are hereby appointed to act on behalf of the Successor Agency for purposes of the proceedings for the issuance of the refunding bonds. Upon receipt of direction from the Oversight Board, the Successor Agency will engage a fiscal consultant to undertake the preparation of the necessary report for the issuance of the bonds to refund the Prior Bonds.

Section 6. Effective Date. This resolution shall take effect from and after the date of approval and adoption thereof.

WHEREAS, the Assets are specialized vehicles that are equipped with equipment including computerized paint matching system, pressure washer, wash sink, and sand blaster which are to be used in graffiti abatement and eradication activities;

WHEREAS, the net salvage value of these Assets as of June 30, 2013 is \$32,146;

WHEREAS, the Successor Agency has identified that these Assets are appropriate for transfer to the County for use by the graffiti abatement program;

WHEREAS, pursuant to HSC 34181(f), amended by Assembly Bill 1484, requires that all actions taken pursuant to the disposal of assets and property of the former redevelopment agency shall be approved by resolution of the Oversight Board at a public meeting after at least 10 days' notice to the public;

#### BACKGROUND: Summary (continued)

On December 20, 2005, the Board of Directors of the Redevelopment Agency for the County of Riverside approved the purchase of two graffiti abatement vehicles and allocated \$212,000 in redevelopment funds for the purchase of the vehicles for the Countywide Graffiti Abatement Program, via Agenda Item 4.1. The initial funding was provided by redevelopment funds, with a portion of the cost to be reimbursed out of the 2006-2007 County budget based on the use of the trucks outside of the redevelopment project areas.

On May 22, 2007, the Board of Supervisors authorized the procurement of an additional graffiti abatement van, via Agenda Item 3.17, and additionally, on December 18, 2007, the Board of Supervisors authorized, via Agenda Item 3.81, the procurement of a fourth graffiti abatement vehicle for use in the 4<sup>th</sup> District and portions of the 5<sup>th</sup> District. The additional vehicles were authorized to be purchased with redevelopment funds. All four of the graffiti abatement vehicles were owned by the Redevelopment Agency, and subsequent to the dissolution of redevelopment, by the Successor Agency.

The winding down of redevelopment activity has resulted in the transfer of the operations of the Graffiti Abatement Program from a Successor Agency function to a county function. The Successor Agency recommends transferring the ownership of the graffiti abatement vehicles to Riverside County.

The graffiti abatement vehicles are specialized vehicles that are equipped with a computerized paint matching system, pressure washer, wash sink, and sand blaster. Attachment A lists the description of each vehicle, original purchase cost, and equipment. The original purchase price of the four graffiti trucks is approximately \$425,000. After almost ten (10) years of useful life, the net salvage value of the four graffiti vehicles as of June 30, 2013 is \$32,146.

In the interest of public service, the Successor Agency recommends the transfer of the graffiti vehicles to the County for use in the County's Graffiti Abatement Program. Due to the minimal value of the vehicles, the transfer to the County will be for zero dollars (\$0).

### BACKGROUND:

#### Summary '

On February 26, 2008, the Board of Directors approved the Consulting Services Agreement with RHA Landscape Architects Planners, Inc. (RHA) to design the Rancho Jurupa Regional Sports Park (Park). During design, protected habitat areas were discovered which required a redesign of the westernmost soccer fields and modification of the site drainage plan. On June 29, 2010, the Board of Directors approved the First Amendment to the agreement with RHA for redesign services. Shortly after construction began in February 2011, RHA was required to perform additional staking due to the adjustments made for the protected habitat areas, as well as perform additional electrical engineering for permanent power to the well site and provide additional construction support services. The Successor Agency is therefore amending and extending the contract for these additional services until completion of the project which is anticipated September 2014.

The costs associated with the Second Amendment are listed on the Recognized Obligation Payment Schedule 13-14A (ROPS) for the period of July 1, 2013 through December 31, 2013, and have been approved by the Oversight Board and the California Department of Finance.

During design of the Park, the water supply was found to be insufficient and use of non-potable ground water from a well would be necessary. The well work consists of a new irrigation water well, pumping plant, irrigation water storage reservoir and irrigation booster station. The well project required completion in two separate phases; Phase 1, for the exploration to determine if the well site provided adequate amount of water volume and pressure, and Phase 2, to install the permanent pumping equipment and water storage reservoir.

On June 29, 2010, the Board approved the plans and specifications for the Rancho Jurupa Regional Sports Park Well Pumping Equipment and Storage Reservoir Project (Phase 1) for the drilling of the well and authorized the Clerk of the Board to advertise for bids. On October 5, 2010, the Board of Directors awarded the construction of Phase 1 for the well to Bakersfield Well & Pump Company. Phase 1 was successfully completed and a Notice of Completion was filed on May 1, 2012.

To provide water to the park until completion of Phase 2 of the Well Pumping Equipment and Storage Reservoir, a temporary water reservoir tank and supply lines were rented. Installation of the temporary tank, supply lines and rental fees through December 2012, were included in ASR Constructor's construction contract, however, those payments ceased when ASR filed bankruptcy. To avoid the removal of the temporary tank and supply lines, EDA paid rents to keep the equipment onsite for the benefit of the project on behalf of the Successor Agency through a Purchase Order issued by Riverside County Purchasing in the amount of \$28,150 which covers the rental fees through December 2014, or until construction of the permanent water reservoir tank is complete.

#### **BACKGROUND:**

#### **Summary (continued)**

On December 10, 2013 the Board approved the revised plans and specifications for the Well Pumping Equipment and Storage Reservoir for the completion of Phase 2 of the well installation. A bidders conference was held on January 7<sup>th</sup> with bids closing on January 27<sup>th</sup>. Once the contract is awarded, construction is estimated to take 150 calendar days to complete. During construction it is required to have a material testing and inspection firm oversee grading, compaction, and perform testing on materials installed. CHJ Consultants was selected from a list of pre-qualified consultants (MO 3.34 8/28/12) based on their qualifications to provide these required services in the amount of \$19,969.

Staff recommends that the Board approve the attached Second Amendment with RHA, accept assignment of the purchase order issued by the county to the Successor Agency, and approve the attached consulting services agreement with CHJ Consultants in the cumulative amount of \$111,119.

#### Impact on Residents and Businesses

The Park is heavily utilized by the surrounding community and soccer clubs throughout the area. To maintain the viability of this thriving park, it is imperative to have the permanent water supply and service.

#### **Additional Fiscal Information**

Expenditures for FY 2013/14 are estimated at \$95,000; expenditures for FY 2014/15 are estimated at \$16,119 for a combined total of \$111,119. All costs associated with these agreements have been included on the ROPS 13-14B and are within the overall approved budget for the project. The costs will be fully funded through Jurupa Valley Redevelopment Capital Improvement Bond Proceeds, thus no net county costs will be incurred and no budget adjustment will be required.
