Thanks for the opportunity to comment on re-districting. Briefly, I've served as an Illinois township trustee and now live in Riverside.

I was a social worker for 6 years and have worked in the retirement plans and insurance industry for about 19 years. So, I suggest

I'm not a Sunday morning pundit or 'expert' (who demands that schools get re-opened only to pull their kids from school as soon as that occurs).

Does the County acknowledge that this year's redistricting will be more challenging than most? Regardless of one's public policy

perspective, the Census was tinkered with. Do you recall another year where folks tried to change how questions were worded or

to end the Census data collection period about 1 month early. Hence, the reasonable person perceives that the data collected

from the imperfect Census is well, inaccurate.

I wrote to mention that with the current Board, it's not the maps, its the supervisors themselves. For example, they disagreed with a

Public Health official that the board appointed. Hence, Dr. Kaiser wasn't allowed to act as he saw fit; something this Board does every day.

They didn't find fault with how he ran the office, though rescinded a vital order! Whether 84 or in 5th grade, whether healthy or not, people are

still dying of this very real virus. One must wonder if the Board acted differently, if our County would have fewer resident deaths

and fewer residents with post covid chronic conditions. Also, the board made our County look like a circus based on how they went

about rescinding the order. .

Removing a CEO and Public Health officer within weeks, during a pandemic and uncertain economic times makes little sense and appears

to go against the Board's near-fiduciary responsibility to ensure the fiscal and public policy stability within the County. Let's not forget,

the County is an issuer of BONDS. Those bonds are partially based on the Board's actions and perceived risk profile.

This Board is supposedly fiscally conservative. Yet, they have deferred compensation. Is that AWARDED on merit? As far as the idea

that the deferred compensation is in lieu of paid time off, the majority of the Board doesn't believe in (mandated) paid time off. Also, are you

saying that each board member's time-off accrual is equivalent to \$12,000 per year? For most families, you use the time off you have and

if you don't use all of it, you lose it. Since there's no usage or 'evaporation,' this is a guaranteed \$12,000 per year; nearly 10% of their

salary. Mr. Hewitt gets pay in lieu of *both* paid time off and Calpers. Doesn't it cost the county more to administer mr. hewitt's plan than to

participate in calpers? When you accept a position, you accept its total compensation. Why is he exempt from that approach?

Isn't the \$143,000 they receive from the 'horrendous, inept, power hungry' government enough? You could put 3 families together and not

have a combined income of \$143,000. I know that's percentage of the judges' salary. Yet, they can use the County's \$8,000 membership in the

Western Riverside County Board of Governments to either lobby to change the formula or for the County to have the LOCAL CONTROL to set

county board supervisor salaries.

Please consider that my wife and my car loans total \$500+ and i just read that a 2021 Range Rover has a monthly payment of about \$490.

Hence, even if the Board 'needs' a car allowance (socialistic, isn't it?) why must it be the equivalent of two cars or a high end car?

If I'm working for a company and am REQUIRED to attend a meeting, I don't get an additional stipend. I don't understand the rationale

behind most board members being paid a stipend over and above the excessive other compensation and benefits they receive.

Also, I doubt this, the deferred compensation and car allowance are due to A STATE MANDATE.

Group health insurance premiums appear to be \$820 per Board member per month? Or is this for them and their spouses (Socialism!).

If the Board would like help shopping for less expensive coverage, I can recommend a few colleagues.

Despite having a fiscally conservative board, the County faces a deficit, one of the most divided populaces I've ever seen and a Sheriff

who admits to not doing his job by telling us what he won't enforce. If John Smith doesn't do all 10 tasks on his job description, he either

doesn't keep his job or he gets paid less.

Yes, the Sheriff is an elected official. Yet, the Board has a near fiduciary responsibility to ensure the County is seen in a neutral or positive light,

that decent risk management principles are adhered to, and the people see value in the services provided.

This Sheriff lied to our faces when he said his deputies didn't damage the window of an imported car near downtown, despite there being video evidence.

The sheriff failed to enforce County ordinances on county property during a county board meeting. The Sheriff has done nothing to put a stop to

or reduce the settlements that are being paid out. In fact, some would argue his machismo doesn't set a solid example for the rest of the RCSO

staff. At what point does the Board act to fix the lack of risk management, lack of brand management, and dereliction of duty?

You may be aware that in Moreno Valley, AMR has a 10+ minute average response time. This isn't a best practice. Cities large and small have up to

a 7-8 minute response time. Despite this lack of gold-standard service, county residents receive a bill for \$1,200. Aside from the cost, LIVES ARE AT STAKE.

When Officer Moye was shot, it seems like he was transported by Riverside City PD helicopter. I believe they used their R-22. That must have been a tight fit.

Is it possible it crossed officers' minds that AMR has a horrendous response time?

When I've spoken to my Board Member he's said he's only one person. Yes, but it's a small Board. He's also the person who brags about his decades

of fire service experience. What good is that experience if its not put to use?

Let's not forget the wonderful new jail. The new jail where you can't meet in person with an inmate. Consider that most people in the jail haven't

been convicted yet. So, if you deny a person basic civil rights, you can expect a lawsuit. What experts designed this jail? Why not allow virtual

visits from a relative's home - at nominal cost - instead of requiring someone to drive to the jail to interact via video? Yet again, my

board member said it was done before he was on the board. Is he not able to request a bid for a retrofit or identify a workaround before the

county is sued? Is that not what the deferred compensation is for?

Hence, when the candidates and incumbents are the likes of Spiegel, Hewitt, Jefferies, etc. IT DOESN'T MATTER WHAT THE MAPS LOOK LIKE. We'd still end up a divided, angry, spendthrift County with not enough to show for it.

On behalf of the City of Perris, I am writing to express concerns over the proposed redrawing of the Supervisorial District borders for the Riverside County Board of Supervisors, specifically in relation to the proposed redistricting map boundaries between the Cities of Perris and Moreno Valley. The City of Perris is one of the fastest-growing Cities in the region, with a 2020 Census population of 78,700. Our neighboring City of Moreno Valley is the second largest City in the County with a 2020 Census population of 208,634. Both Perris and Moreno Valley Cities share more than a border whose residents readily cross boundaries for work, infrastructure, recreation, health care, and other key social and economic networks. For these reasons and as further explained below, it is prudent for the City of Perris to remain within the same district with our neighboring City of Moreno Valley.

Together we share urgent common concerns as we work collaboratively on vital issues of shared interest critical to our socio-economic growth and quality of life, including but not limited to public safety, fire protection, transportation, infrastructure, water, energy, education, environmental protection and economic and workforce development. For the past years, we have worked collaboratively on the growth of our cities and wish to continue this progressive relationship for the benefit of our residents. The Cities of Moreno Valley and Perris work together as a unified community due to our geographic boundaries, such as channels, freeways, thoroughfares, industrial corridors, school districts, and shared history, including a rich expansion of socio-economic development and ethnic composition. We are also bound by shared interests in the March Air Reserve Base given our location adjacent to the base. Furthermore, both state assembly and congressional districts include Moreno Valley and Perris.

We urge you to support the redistricting that would allow for both Cities of Perris and Moreno Valley to remain within the same district boundaries. We strongly oppose any redistricting map that would split our two Cities into two Supervisory Districts, effectively diluting our collective voice. Spreading our residents between multiple Districts would be in violation of the common-sense principles that guide redistricting to avoid splitting up communities that share critical common concerns. Such a decision would defy logic and carry damaging ramifications for our communities, especially minority populations who have suffered unduly under the pandemic.

Perris and Moreno Valley have worked together through leadership and strategic development to grow our economic engine that is making critical strides to increase job opportunities, cultural and ethnic amenities, and the quality of life for an increasingly diverse population. Residents deserve equal representation through a unified voice as a community where our shared interests can be presented in a unified manner. For these reasons, I urge you to reject any proposed map changes that jeopardize the socio-economic interests of the culturally diverse and ethnically rich residents of the Community of Interests containing Moreno Valley and Perris.

Honorable Board Members:

The Inland Empire Redistricting Hub is a coalition of community organizations who are dedicated to ensuring fair maps in the counties of Riverside and San Bernardino. We appreciate all the work you, staff, and the commission have done in an effort to draw fair maps in Riverside County. However, we are very concerned about the proposed maps to date. We had hoped that with the introduction of

draft maps E, F, & G we would see a departure from previous drafts given the community push back on maps A through D, but it appears our concerns were neither heard nor honored.

On September 27th, 2021 Sky Allen emailed rivcoredistricting@rivco.org a number of Communities of Interest testimonies collected by the 22 organizations who make up the Inland Empire Redistricting Hub. Some of the priority Communities of Interest included keeping the Latino communities of Jurupa Valley and Riverside City together. These communities are cohesive in their shared socioeconomic interests. A second high priority Community of Interest was ensuring Moreno Valley and Perris were kept together. Like Jurupa Valley and Riverside, there is a cohesive Latino community spanning the two cities. The third high priority Community of Interest was keeping black and Latino communities of Hemet and San Jacinto within a district shared with Perris and Moreno Valley.

On Thursday, October 14th 2021, Michael Gomez Daly submitted a narrative and accompanying maps that prove the commission has the ability to draw 2 VRA compliant districts with Latino CVAP above 51%. One of those districts also has a Black CVAP over 14%. The two districts are as follows: 1) Jurupa Valley, Riverside City, El Cerrito, and segments of Corona City; and 2) Moreno Valley, Mead Valley, Perris, and communities in Hemet and San Jacinto.

The undersigned organizations do not support any of the draft maps that have been proposed and urge you to revisit the drawing process and demand you consider the Communities of Interest testimonies that were previously submitted as well as ensuring CVAP requirements are adhered to in your maps.

Dear Advisory Redistricting Commission Members:

Valley-Wide Recreation and Park District ("District") welcomes this opportunity to comment regarding the proposed redistricting of the Riverside County Supervisorial districts. Only through collaboration and cooperation are the various County agencies, municipalities and special districts able to work together to achieve the quality of life our Riverside County residents have come to enjoy and expect. While the County is awaiting the finalized census data, we want to take this opportunity to share with you our thoughts regarding the boundaries as they relate to Supervisor Districts 3 and 5, with particular emphasis on the current boundaries of our District.

The District feels that the current boundaries of Supervisor Districts 3 and 5 should remain as close to their current configuration as possible. (Map Option "C" attached)

Most of the District territory is located in the unincorporated areas of Supervisor District 3, along with the cities of Hemet and San Jacinto, but we also serve parks located in the City of Menifee which is wholly located in Supervisor District 5. We work with the City of Menifee, which also provides parks and recreation services to its residents, and have no objection to the city being located in Supervisor District 5. However, if the city were to detach from the District through the LAFCO process sometime in the future, essentially all District boundaries would be located in Supervisor District 3.

As mentioned initially, it is important to have strong, collaborative relationships with the various entities responsible for providing service to the same geographic area.

Working with the County on projects of mutual benefit can only be successful if we continue to build and strengthen those relationships. <u>By leaving the majority of the District's service area in supervisor District 3, we feel those goals are better achieved</u>.

Additionally, as much of the District's service area is located in unincorporated areas, continuing to keep the District's boundaries in one supervisor district provides stability to communities of interest that may be considering incorporation. Even what might seem as minor adjustments to supervisor district boundaries could potentially affect those efforts as local communities move forward with their long-term strategic planning.

In consideration of the above, the District feels that **the current boundaries of Supervisor Districts 3 and 5 should remain as close to their current configuration as possible**. We understand the challenges that the Commission faces with adjusting the supervisor districts to comply with the population balance requirements of the California Elections Code. In a county that has been labeled one of the fastest growing in the country over the past few decades, our population has certainly increased. The District believes, however, that the growth has been widespread throughout the County, and that the supervisor district boundaries will not need to be adjusted significantly in order to account for the population gains. This will also keep diversity representation within our communities which has been key to the success of Riverside County.

Thank you again for the opportunity to express our opinion regarding the current Riverside County redistricting efforts. We believe that **maintaining the current boundaries of Supervisor Districts 3 and 5 is in the best interest of the residents of those districts**, and we look forward to the final decision of the Advisory Redistricting Commission and the Board of Supervisors.

Re: Correction to October 8, 2021 Letter Regarding Supervisorial Elections

Dear Members of the Riverside County Board of Supervisors and Members of the Riverside County Redistricting Advisory Commission:

I write to make a correction to the letter I sent on behalf of MALDEF (Mexican American Legal Defense and Educational Fund) on October 8, 2021 regarding draft maps released by Riverside County and compliance with state and federal law.

In that letter, I discussed that it appears possible to draw two districts in the western part of Riverside County with greater than 50% Latino citizen voting age population (LCVAP) and I gave an example of two potential majority LCVAP districts that could be drawn. The following correction should be made to the description of the second potential majority LCVAP district:

- Instead of: "Another potential majority LCVAP district may be drawn in southwest Riverside County containing the communities of Norco, Woodcrest, Temescal Valley, Meadowbrook, and Lake Elsinore."
- The letter should read: "Another potential majority LCVAP district may be drawn that includes the communities of Moreno Valley, Perris, Good Hope, Meadowbrook, Lakeview, Nuevo, Romoland, and Homeland."
